The Village of Centreville wishes to welcome the **Western Valley Regional Service Commission** Office to Centreville. It is located in the Sherwood Centre at 3143 Main Street. The Western Valley Regional Service Commission helps rural communities and residents assess their future development options and design ways of managing change in their communities through land use planning. Building and development permits are required to protect both the property owner and the surrounding community by ensuring that any proposed construction is in conformity with applicable regulations. Building permits are also required to ensure that construction meets National Building Code of Canada standards. Subdivision approvals may also require approvals from other government departments, such as Watercourse and Wetland Alteration permits, Crown Land approvals, and Department of Health approval for on-site sewage disposal.

**The Village of Centreville has a “Dog By-Law” in which it is stated that:**

8. 1. The owner of a dog commits an offense under this regulation if:
- (a) he permits his dog to run at large;
  - (b) he refuses or neglects to register his dog under section 4 of this regulation;
  - (c) he refuses or neglects to attach and keep attached a licensed tag to the collar of his dog;
  - (d) he refuses or neglects to cause his dog to wear a collar at all times other than when it is in the kennel or residence;
  - (e) he permits his dog to chase or run after pedestrians or motor vehicles;
  - (f) he permits his dog to bark incessantly so that annoyance is caused to the public; or
  - (g) he harbors, owns, or keeps a Pit-Bull, or Rottweiler contrary to section 4.8;

**If you have any questions or issues concerning dogs in the Village of Centreville, please call 328-7771 and report these concerns to the Animal Control Officer.**



**The Village of Centreville also has an Unsightly Premises By-law. This By-law states:**

**190.01(1)** No person shall permit premises owned or occupied by him or her to be unsightly by permitting to remain on any part of such premises

(a) Any ashes, junk, rubbish or refuse,

(b) An accumulation of wood shavings, paper, sawdust or other residue of production or construction,

(c) A derelict vehicle, equipment or machinery or the body or any part of a vehicle, equipment or machinery, or

(d) A dilapidated building.

**190.01(1.1)** No person shall permit a building or structure owned or occupied by him or her to become a hazard to the safety of the public by reason of being vacant or unoccupied.

**190.01(2)** No person shall permit a building or structure owned or occupied by him or her to become a hazard to the safety of the public by reason of dilapidation or unsoundness of structural strength.

**If you require assistance in removing unlicensed/derelict vehicles from your property, please call the Village Office and we will try to help.**



Please do not pour grease drippings down your drains. We have experienced some issues in our underground piping system due to residents and businesses neglecting to dispose of cooking grease in the correct manner. Please use an old container or can and do not use your drains or toilets.
